What a wonderful weekend of shooting. The Temple Gun Club had the range dressed and the weather was just about perfect (what's a little wind). This years attendance increased and the scores really skyrocketed as we tried to predict the number of achievement awards that would be needed based on last years scores. Let me tell you guys, you out did your self, now I have to order more to meet the demand. That is how it should be, too. This year, Steve Damon and Chad Magee attended in full WW2 dress on Saturday as a "Screaming Eagle" and a British sniper. On Sunday, Steve returned but this time was prepared to assault the beach in his USMC camo. We hope to reach some of the other re-enactment members to shoot next years match and have a special side match for those that attend in period dress. It is always interesting to get the true flavor of how the weapons were actually used during their wartime experience.

There were 44 Garand shooters vying for the crown this year and there was a tie that was broken using the standing score that left Robert Langham of Tyler edging Mark Woodard, all with 282-4x. Close behind were Bill Aten and Nez Rongero with 281s. These fellows had no problems with the CMP Greek 69 ammo as they heated up the competition.

This year the 100 yard carbine course of fire was used that included a 10 shot sitting rapid fire string. Gee, those targets are tiny but it seems to be a good test for these rifles. While most had some difficulty along the way, Don Tryce of Austin wrestled and fought with his little carbine and ran away with the match beating the competition handily by sixteen points. Don left the firing line exhausted from the struggle but satisfied with the results. Steve Damon brought in the most unique carbine type and something most had never seen. A Delisle .45 ACP suppressed bolt action carbine. He fired it at 200 yards and about the only sound you could hear was the impact on the target boards. With a rear sight graduated past 200 yards, this carbine was best kept to a more reasonable range of less than 100 yards but it would have been an effective tool for those stealthy operations.

A Vintage Military Rifle (VMR) would include period rifles from other WW1-WW2 countries along with our Krag and the 1917 Enfield. We have seen a wide spectrum of rifles and there seems to be those that are much easier to well than others. This year was a repeat of last year as Robert Langham pulled his Swiss K-31 out to clobber all comers with their SMLE, Enfields and Mausers.

The real battle developed in the 1903 Springfield match as a 3-way tie brought us to the point of deciding a tie breaker. Since the normal tie breakers didn't fit, we went to the highest score standing. After all, the best standing shooter has to be worth more than the best prone shooter if all shots are at the same distance. When the sorting was done, Robert Boyd of Baird came out on top with Robert Langham edging Mark Woodard, all firing 280-4x and 03A3s to boot.

I would ask that you start now encouraging the local club shooters you see to bring out their arsenals and blow out the cob webs with you next year. I think all will find this match format a fun way to use these wonderful old rifles and see the unique examples of our past heritage.
