Ron made the highly prized President's 100 at Camp Perry in August, won the Texas State Rifle Association service rifle championship, the Louisiana Shooter's Association rifle championship and finished the shooting year as the PCGC 2001 club champion. That is quite a run against some very good competition. We all congratulate Ron on this year's accomplishment. This will add another chapter in Ron's book of life.

The October match was cancelled due to rain, so the November match became the championship match, coinciding with opening day of deer season. The numbers were down but the shooting was still up to par. Tommy Williams firing his match rifle turned in a 484-1 7x to become the high master champion while Richard Schultz grabbed the master class championship with a high master score of 485-12x. Firing an old time rifle (M1A) for the last time as an expert (movin' on up), Bob Quinn became the expert champion with a 455-9x score. In sharpshooter class, it was Skip Smith firing his first clean rapid-fire string in competition and scoring a 467-4 (need to work on that x count). Allan Long won marksman class with a solid expert score of 454-6x.

It is great to look back on the last year's results and see the marked improvement by many of you. Also, it is encouraging to see the number of new names on the rooster. It looks like there is life in the shooting program, but we can't rest. Be aware of the potential shooters you cross paths with, you would be surprised at the number of people looking for shooting venues. Let's be ambassadors for shooting in 2002. I challenge you to bring someone new into the sport in the next year.

The 2002 schedule will begin with a January match on the 5th; it will be a 50-shoot match. Hope to see you in December (1st), if not, best wishes for the holidays and New Year.
