Well, I never would have thought we would make 2 days of shooting without getting everything we owned soaked. The 2001 PCGC Regional Championship was almost washed out by the rains that postponed the first shot for over one hour. Just when things seemed doomed, there was a glimmer of blue sky to the west and by the time the rain had ended, we were met with a clear sky and near perfect shooting conditions in the "tunnel". 66 able shooters that had journeyed from as far away as Florida, Mississippi and Kansas contested the regional. As with past regionals, the competition was a strong field as represented by the scores. But I must say, that this was one of the best matches we have run and this is due to the cooperation and assistance the shooters pitched in. Without your patience, this could have been a real soggy weekend and for myself and PCGC, I thank you for your presence and willingness to be flexible as we changed the firing plans, sometimes several times, to get the match completed in its entirety.

By the time the 600-yard line was complete, there was a hint of things to come. It's beginning to become a habit for Michael Carter to press the would be challengers from the first shot and this was to be the case as the match progressed. The first relay paced the match when Jon Rhynard fired his 198-10x and Bill Walter trailed by an x. But up walked Michael on the second relay to nail the match 4 victory with 11 x's.

The trip to the short line seems to bring out the best in the old folks and who other than Kernice Landry would step up to the line. Kernice was scattered only 3 nines in his string to overshadow the rest of the field with a marvelous 197-3x performance. He really had his sights set for the range record but this will entice him to come back next year for another run at it.

The 200-yard rapid-fire match brought disappointment to several shooters of great groups and scores when the match was decided on x count, again. Of the four cleans fired, Jon Rhynard's had what it took – 14 xs. It always seems a shame to be beaten by an x. Ron Chatelain was clean with 8 xs, Bill Walter with 11 xs and Michael Carter with 12 xs. Great shooting by each of these guys, someone had to win; it may be yours next time.

Again, the pressure was on from the first relay to fire at 300 yards as Alonda Roy drilled a clean with 5 xs. But it was Madison Shambarger taking the win away with his 200-7x on the final match of the day. With the failing light, these two didn't seem to have much problem. So, what is the excuse for the rest of us? I thought so...

In the overall aggregate match, Michael Carter pilled up too many points to be contested seriously as he led the pace with 790-33x. Second was captured by the high senior shooter on the line, Kernice Landry managed to put together a solid performance to post a 787-27x. The high woman, Alonda Roy grabbed the third spot with her 782-27x. High junior was Justin Utley with 736-17x. Bill Walter won the rapid-fire aggregate with 399-20 and Kernice was the slow fire aggregate leader with 394-15.

High master class winners were Jon Rhynard in the match rifle category and Bill Walter in the service rifle group. Master class was all Madison Shambarger in the match rifle category and Daniel Miller grabbed the service rifle lead. The combined Expert class was captured by Jim Barron with John Peck picking up the win in Sharpshooter class and Brett Neyland getting the win in the Marksman class.

The LEG match had a similar beginning to the day as the rain ended about 6 a.m. and conditions were as good as it gets in this part of the world when the match started. 38 non-distinguished shooters vied for the points as the medals were grabbed by 3 distinguished shooters that pushed the envelope. Jeff Rost smoked the match with his 495-15x followed by Bill Walter with his 491-20x and Alonda Roy repeated her third place finish from the previous day with a 490-18x. There should be 4 legs awarded to Daniel Miller (483-18x) and Gary Cook (479-9x). The next two shooters should be receiving a special package soon. Michael Carter (478-8x) and Larry Osowski (476-13x) should have completed their quest for the highly esteemed "Distinguished" classification, as these points should finish them out. Welcome to a very unique group of shooters that understand and appreciate your accomplishment. This recognition cannot be earned in a reduced course match or by pure persistence, you had to pursue this goal on the same playing field as all those before you. It is something to be very proud and honored to accomplish.

On the firing line, we had a rainbow of the shooting community, beginning shooters to veterans, old and young. It is truly a diverse crowd we run in. Managing the whole affair is a formidable task that Wilburn Spiller grasped with his years of experience as he called the firing lines for the entirety of the match. His ability to keep things moving was greatly appreciated by everyone as the day progressed. Also, there are so many others that pitched in as needed to help where needed. It is this willingness that exemplifies the high power shooters we will always welcome to our range. Thanks for giving us a weekend of your time and I hope it was worth your time. If so, I hope to see you next year or just the next time we come to the line.
